

## **ANNUAL REPORT 2018: Bangalore Site.**

**Sisters of the Good Shepherd – Province of South West India, Bangalore, Karnataka.**

### **Introduction:**

Bangalore site operates through five sub sites to reach out to the 1242 children and 12 elderly whom we consider as the target population. The split up of the total figure provides us a figure of 859 girls, 383 boys and 12 elderly. Going to an in-depth analysis we receive our supported children's data as 592 children in primary schools 450 in high schools 159 receiving university education and 41 in professional studies.

### **Education:**

#### Accomplishments

- 98% children were successfully promoted to the next grade in primary and secondary levels. 13 children successfully completed their professional studies and is working with reputed institutions. 41 children are in the path of professional education who are tomorrows' assurance.
- The 19 supplementary education centers started with a vision of handholding the children to attain quality educational support is functioning successfully.
- Career guidance program threw light on the future career planning and child competency assessment turned to be fruitful opening up new arenas for slow learners.

#### Goals

- To ensure quality education for children through supplementary education centers leading to zero dropouts.
- To organize children's group sessions to develop their leadership skills, identify their dreams and initiate capacities, knowledge in planning for their future.

### **Health and Hygiene:**

#### Accomplishments:

- Provided toilets for 100 families to have safe environment and privacy.

- Medical health checkup camps and health card issued to all children.
- Adolescent education to boys and girls followed by active panel discussion.

### Goals

- Hygiene education to all sponsored families to have family toilet for all in the sub site of GSC Bellary and GSI Manvi and proper use of it.
- To maintain individual child health record and ensure that all the sponsored children have good health and access to medical care.

### Nutrition:

#### Accomplishments:

- Boarding Children were provided with mess fee which enabled them to avail nutritious food.
- Sponsored families were provided with provision.

#### Goals:

- To improve the health of the Children by providing them balanced diet.

### Community

#### Accomplishments:

- 86 girls / women were issued certificates in cutting and tailoring through Skills @ Chalice programs.
- 70 non-sponsored families were helped with income generating activities, house repairs and toilet facilities through Gift Catalogue.

- To improve the economic development of the family/ community.

- Approached the government to avail the various government schemes for families.
- A greater participation of sponsored families in decision making process regarding the benefit they receive.

- Awareness to the parents regarding Importance of parents in children's growth and performance.

### Accomplishments:

- Handholding families' to be more responsible and live a dignified life.
- Training for CCG members were conducted on DFF manual, and CTF fund utilization which helped the members to know more about Chalice and its interest in the growth of the community.
- CCG leader's training on managerial skills were conducted.
- Regular monthly Meetings.

### Goal

- To strengthen the groups to act responsibly.
- To train the office bearers on Managerial skills and book keeping
