

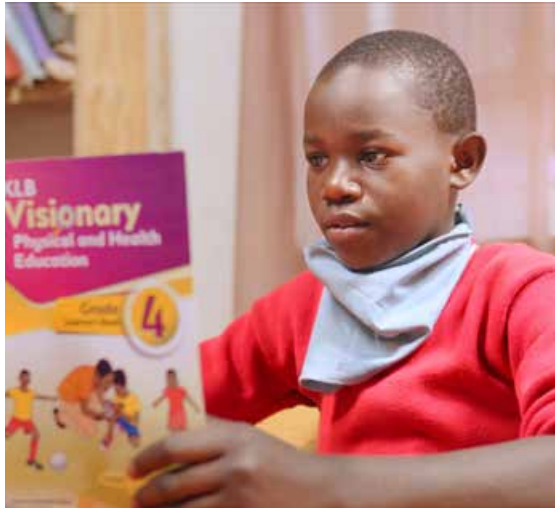


Annual Report 2019-2020

Nairobi site Nairobi, Kenya



Chalice has been working with our Nairobi site partners since 1996, starting with the Starehe Boys Centre, and currently partnering with the Institute for Law & Environmental Governance (ILEG). The site works mainly with children from Nairobi's urban informal housing neighbourhoods, which have few utilities or public services, and two homes for vulnerable children. The site focuses on improving the quality of the children's education, nutrition, health and hygiene. Sponsored students at the Starehe Boys Centre are gifted students from impoverished backgrounds who are completing their secondary education at the renowned school.



- Our site had 137 sponsored boys at the university and college level.
- 30 graduated after successfully completing their studies.
- Our site also enrolled 700 children for sponsorship from the poorest sections of Nairobi:
- 300 new enrollments were from a low-income neighborhood.
- 250 new enrollments were from one of two children's homes.
- 15 newly enrolled children had previously never attended school before due to lack of financial resources.
- 17 new enrollments from a primary school are children with disabilities.



- Our site served 365 sponsored families living in the poor sections of Nairobi.
- We supported families who were suffering hunger due to the pandemic.
- We supplied face masks to school going children to protect them from COVID-19.
- Site staff trained and formed 13 family circles whose members are active and participate well.
- Each family circle has 15 members which meet every month (as COVID-19 precautions permit) to pray together, share with one another and save small amounts of money to build their capital funds.
- The members have opened their own family bank accounts.



- Our site has developed networking with schools, children's homes, health facilities, parents, family circles and the administration in the areas where we serve.
- The site purchased school furniture (2 large storage cabinets, 1 large table and 8 chairs) for a classroom of primary students with cerebral palsy.
- The site hosted an online youth entrepreneurship conference.
