



Chalice has partnered with the Sisters of the Cross of Chavanod (Tenali provincialate) in the Andhar Pradesh state since 2012. The site serves families living in a very remote and isolated communities, which lacks basic facilities and faces high rates of poverty, illiteracy and HIV/AIDS. The focuses on providing access to education, improved health and hygiene, and the mental health and stability of both the children and the families. They run the Vianney Home for vulnerable children with disabilities, stigmatized illnesses, or who have lost one or both parents. The Sisters ensure that those affected by HIV have access to nutritious diets and work to improve the sanitation of their communities.





- Nellore site supports 707 sponsored children.
- 362 children received a medical check up
- 305 children received a dental check-up. Of these,
 30 children received further dental treatments.
- The site provided medical assistance to 40 members of remote communities.
- The Site also provided medical assistance 40 children living with HIV/AIDS.



- Nellore site works with 38 family circles.
- During the COVID-19 shutdown, the most urgent challenge was food insecurity. In addition to their sponsorship funds, the site supported them with money from Chalice's COVID-19 disaster relief fund and the gift catalogue.





Community

• Nellore site started a project that will install pipes, a motor and a 10,000 litre water tank to deliver clean water to the 85 people (9 sponsored) who live in the Hamlet of Paguluchennuru.
