



## Annual Report 2018-2019

### Pochaiv site: Pochaiv, Ukraine



Our site works with families caught in the grasp of poverty who aren't able to perform their financial, economic, living, communicative and educative functions. Poverty doesn't allow these families to provide the most important needs of their children. Therefore, they are participants of our sponsorship program.



### Education

#### Goals

1. To receive sponsorship funds and continue educational support for our sponsored children.
2. To increase the percentage of sponsored children aged 16+.
3. To search ways for inclusive education for children with disabilities.
4. To arrange educational-rehabilitation for children sick with cerebral palsy in each location via the Chalice gift catalogue program.

#### Achievements

1. All school aged children have access to free mandatory state education.
2. Sponsored children of pre-school and school age have **100%** access to quality school supplies and textbooks.
3. **15%** of young adults aged 16+ are attending higher educational institutions. They are also provided with educational supplies.

### Health & hygiene

#### Goals

1. To maintain stable hygienic conditions for each sponsored family.
2. To continue educating parents on infectious diseases prevention.
3. To provide more knowledge for parents on vaccination and HIV/AIDS.

#### Achievements

1. Families have the opportunity to renew bedding sets and towels for each sponsored child annually at the expense of our site.
2. Our site is capable of providing each family with washing powders and soap.
3. Families were provided with firewood via Chalice's critical needs program which allowed children to live in warmth and not to get sick in winter time.

### Nutrition

#### Goals

1. To conduct an annual weigh-in for children and monitor their height.
2. To continue quarterly trainings on healthy eating.
3. To print a brochure for parents with brief summary on causes of childhood obesity and ways to prevent and remedy this issue.



#### Achievements

1. Each family has financial capacity to purchase quarterly food supplies.
2. Our sponsored children's nutrition became balanced respective to the need and age of a child.
3. Mothers took a course on healthy eating and obtained skills to cook meals at home.

### Community

#### Goals

1. To embrace marginalized groups to the fullest extent and involve them in community and location development.
2. To implement meeting attendance records in each family circle to control attendance.
3. To continue partnership with communities in education and improve sanitary conditions in the schools our sponsored children attend.

#### Achievements

1. General community meetings were conducted in each location.
2. Memorandum with local authorities was signed on support of village schools sponsored children study at. We were able to provide schools with interactive equipment via the gift catalogue.
3. Washrooms in **four** village schools were renovated.
4. Received an opportunity to have feedback from principals on the academic performance of our sponsored children.

### Family

#### Goals

1. To involve small farmers' families in projects to teach them correct care of livestock.
2. To provide farmers' families with micro-grants for their barns' maintenance.
3. To monitor parents' groups meetings and direct their efforts towards development and self-improvement.
4. To continue quarterly trainings for parents on financial literacy.
5. To find the financial capacity to provide parents with one time free legal consultation.

#### Achievements

1. Each sponsored family is included in a parents' group and formed into family circles.
2. Each family member has right to vote in a parents self-government election.
3. Each family is able to take part in mutual aid fund.
4. Families can conduct meetings and make joint decisions quarterly.
5. Families have received access to professional trainings on budgeting.

### Family funding

#### Goals

1. To transition to family funding by June 2020.
2. To form **50** more financial groups amongst sponsorship benefit recipients.
3. To maintain quarterly reporting and monitoring of sponsorship funds.
4. To give mothers more power on sponsorship funds budgeting and spending.



#### Achievements

1. **53** financial groups are already formed.
2. Individual bank accounts have been opened for **1199** participants.
3. A mandatory written reporting form for sponsorship funds has been implemented.
4. Meetings and financial groups reporting take place on quarterly basis.
