- Some students also have albinism, which means they do not have pigment in their skin, hair, and eyes.

The big challenge: more students than classrooms

St. Odilia is one of very few schools for visually impaired children in northern Zambia. A growing number of students are traveling from distant provinces seeking its high-quality education. As a result, the classrooms are crowded. Cramped and uncomfortable, the children can't focus. Their teachers find it difficult to give the students the individual attention they need.

St. Odilia needs a new classroom

- St. Odilia is going to construct a new 210 m² building!
- It will have three classrooms with two small offices in between.
- They will have weather resistant roofs and ceilings and good lighting.
